



Most Australians have bought or received a gift card. Many gift cards sold have an expiry date. Some consumers have had gift cards expire before they have been able to use the value stored on the card.

Where a gift card expires before the value can be used, consumers lose the value still on the card.

The Government is considering options to regulate gift card expiry dates and wants to hear from consumers like you. If you have had an experience using a gift card let us know.
